

SUMMARY REPORT

Training Workshop on Organizational Network Analysis and Launch of the Philippines Training and Learning Circle for Community-Based Disaster Risk management

AIM Conference Center, Makati City, Philippines

11-14 December 2007

The Training and Learning Circle (TLC) on Community Based Disaster Risk Management is a support network for trainers and learners. This was initiated by the Center for Disaster Preparedness in the Philippines (CDP) and the All-India Disaster Mitigation Institute (AIDMI) with support of the Special Unit for South-South Cooperation (SU/SSC) UNDP Regional Center Bangkok, ProVention Consortium, and the Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC). The TLC aims at enhancing the capacity of trainers in community based disaster risk reduction and the use of participatory and learner-centered tools and methodologies.

The UNDP CADRI, being a global UN facilitator of capacity development initiatives in DRR, supported the start up activities of TLC by facilitating a workshop and providing training on Organizational Network Analysis (ONA) with PACT. The training workshop was aimed at stimulating expanded collaboration, innovation and the wider access or exchange of experience among disaster risk reduction training providers. The training, which was organized by the CDP was held from 11-13 December, 2007 in Makati City, Philippines. This activity was taken advantage of by the CDP to launch the TLC Philippines on 14 December. The launch served as a venue to develop a survey of organizations engaged in CBDRM and map these actors using the ONA tool. A total of 22 participants from seven countries (including CADRI, SSC, ADPC and ProVention) attended the ONA training, while 76 participants, including 22 from the ONA training (both trainees and facilitators), attended the TLC launch.

The Asia TLC Training Workshop and Philippine TLC Launch had five interrelated objectives:

1. Build competency in facilitating Organizational Network Analysis (ONA).
2. Deepen appreciation for social capital and networks as means to strengthen the TLC(s) on CBDRM
3. Enhance relationships and collaboration amongst TLC partners
4. Refine a common vision and strategy for the CBDRM TLC(s)
5. Identify next steps



Asia CBDRM TLC and ONA Training Workshop

Aside from the CBDRM TLC Core Partners, CADRI, UNDP- Indonesia, UNDP-Maldives, UNDP-Sri Lanka, AIDMI partners in Sri Lanka and UNDP-Philippines participated in the Asia CBDRM TLC Workshop. A total of 25 participants and facilitators critically discussed the CBDRM TLC concept and learned and applied Organizational Network Analysis. The Workshop was facilitated by Private Agencies Collaborating Together (PACT). The participation of representatives outside the Core Partners of the CBDRM TLC was supported by the UNDP Regional Programme of the Bureau of Crisis Prevention and Recovery.

Upcoming Activities

AIDMI is expected to launch the TLC India and to hold a workshop to survey and map organizations working on CBDRM in India in February 2008.

A similar workshop is also expected to be held in Sri Lanka. As there is no TLC Sri Lanka at the moment, the result of the survey can be very helpful in identifying key organizations and actors engaged in CBDRM and may form part of the future TLC in Sri Lanka.

A regional workshop in Bangkok shall be held to collate all the information gathered. This will serve as data for the Asia TLC. This workshop will also be an opportunity for the TLC partners to meet and discuss the progress of TLC and synchronize future activities.
